





# LONG BEACH WORLDWIDE FLEXIBLE PRESCIENT FUND

## QUARTERLY INVESTMENT REPORT - Q3 2024

The Long Beach Worldwide Flexible Prescient Fund experienced a positive third quarter. The Fund is fully invested in global equities and ETFs which offer good growth potential. The companies in which the fund is invested are benefitting from structural growth trends including luxury goods, digital commerce and payments, on-demand mobility, travel and remote work, cloud computing and AI, cyber security, and digital advertising. The fund has adhered to its policy objective, and the fund's asset allocation is broadly similar to 30 June 2024.

**Market Environment:** The Federal Reserve delivered a long-expected decision to reduce interest rates and cut the federal funds rate by 50bp basis points in September. This move, aimed at sustaining economic growth amidst moderating inflation and a weakening labour market, lowered the federal funds rate to a range of 4.75% to 5%. The Fed is likely to cut rates further, with possibly one or two additional cuts of 25bp before the end of this year.

**South African Reserve Bank Rate Decision:** The South African Reserve Bank (SARB) cut its interest rate by 25 basis points to 8% in September 2024. This decision was influenced by the country's headline inflation falling to its lowest level in three years, with consumer inflation at 4.4%. The SARB had maintained the rate at 8.25% since May 2023, making this the first rate cut since 2020. The decision aligns with global trends of easing monetary policy to counteract economic slowdowns.

Portfolio Performance: The fund's top holdings include Duolingo, Mercado Libre and DoorDash.

**Duolingo:** Duolingo is a mobile learning platform, with its flagship app being a popular way to learn languages. Duolingo reported impressive growth in the second quarter, with a 41% increase in revenue year-over-year to \$178.3m. The company also reported a 59% increase in daily active users to 34.1m and a 52% increase in paid subscribers to 8m. Duolingo's innovative product improvements and the successful rollout of its higher-priced subscription tier, Duolingo Max, have contributed to its good financial performance.

**Mercado Libre:** Mercado Libre continued its robust performance, reporting a 42% year-over-year increase in revenue to \$5.1 billion for the second quarter. The company's net income increased 103% to \$531m, with a net margin of 10.5%, reflecting enhanced operational efficiency and strong growth in gross merchandise volume (GMV) and total payment volume (TPV). Mercado Libre's strategic focus on technology and innovation has solidified its position as a leading e-commerce and financial services provider in Latin America.

**DoorDash:** DoorDash's total orders increased 19% to 635m in the 2Q2024, while gross order volume (GOV) increased 20% to \$19.7 billion, and revenue increased by 23% to \$2.6 billion. The company's net loss improved significantly, and adjusted EBITDA increased to \$430 million. DoorDash's focus on expanding local commerce and improving operational efficiency has contributed to its financial performance and growth potential. DoorDash recently introduced a Commerce Platform for merchants, where merchants can grow, run, and operate their businesses on their own channels, both in-store and online.
